Dear,

You are cordially invited to participate in our very first roundtable discussion, entitled "Uncomfortable Conversations with Black Men and Marin County Law Enforcement to be held on Tuesday, May 25, 2021, 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. The recent verdict after the George Floyd trial touched many of us emotionally and I was inspired to present this roundtable discussion because the history between black men and law enforcement has been filled with strife, mistrust, and conflict over fundamental issues.

I reached out to the pastors of the Marin City Ministerial Alliance and Play Marin to partner with the Phoenix Project of Marin (a program of Performing Stars) http://phoenixprojectmarin.org to host this crucial discussion that would be happen in Marin City on the anniversary of the tragic death of George Floyd. The invited participants will include two main entities, the black men of the community representing a diverse group of ages and representation of different organizations and the Marin County Law Enforcement agencies: Marin County Sheriff's Department, Mill Valley, Tiburon & Sausalito Police Departments and the California Highway Patrol.

It was important that this discussion would have a facilitator, therefore Dr. Omowale Satterwhite, President Leadership Incorporated (http://leadershipincorporated.org) will provide his professional service. In order to be transparent with both groups, Rev. Dr. Rondell Leggett, First Missionary Baptist Church and I met with Dr. Satterwhite to plan the agenda so everyone will be prepared for the roundtable discussion.

To be perfectly clear, having a difficult or uncomfortable conversation with these two entities doesn't mean you're working against each other. The goal is for you to value each conversation so that you have a respectful and honest dialogue. We know that there are two sides to an uncomfortable conversation and both sides need to get comfortable with discomfort, and instead of treating the conversation like it's one side against the other, with a winner and a loser, to embrace a better way forward.

It is my hope that these conversations will continue to engage other groups in Marin City: Uncomfortable Conversations with Black women, Uncomfortable Conversations with Black Children, Uncomfortable Conversations with the LGBT. The list can go on and on and on.....

Let these conversations serve as a springboard to help all of us move forward and find solutions for social justice in Marin.
